Scripture firmly grounds us in the Faith that death is not the end, that the promise made at Baptism assures us that we who have died with Christ in the waters of Baptism remain with the Lord into Eternal Life. Stewardship Reflection...How do we respond to St. Paul's challenge to give thanks to God in all circumstances? With an attitude of gratitude Christian stewards give their time, talents, and treasure in response to an internal <u>need to give</u> in thanks for God's blessings, and not because someone has a <u>need to receive</u>. Like the rose candle of the Advent Wreath may we "shine on" as we share our blessings in cheerfulness and joy.

Families and the Gospel –December 17 – John 1:6-8, 19-29 – Today's Gospel reports "there is one among you whom you do not recognize." It is hard to believe Christ is present in a family with crazy schedules, suppers that start too late and end too early, cars that don't start, misunderstandings, frustrations, piles of laundry, unmatched socks and stretched food budgets. The list is endless. The words spoken at Mass, "The Lord is with you," are not a hope, they are a fact.

Last Days of Advent – by Pope St. John Paul II – "The liturgy of Advent...helps us to understand fully the value and meaning of the mystery of Christmas. It is not just about commemorating the historical event, which occurred some 2000 years ago in a little village of Judea. Instead, it is necessary to understand that the whole of our life must be an "advent," a vigilant awaiting of the final coming of Christ. To predispose our minds to welcome the Lord Who, as we say in the Creed, one day will come to judge the living and the dead, we must learn to recognize Him Who already came, Who will come, and Who comes continuously."
