SECOND COLLECTION next weekend, November 22 & 23 will take place for Catholic Charities of Altoona-Johnstown. Since 1940, Catholic Charities has helped our neighbors throughout central Pennsylvania regardless of faith or background. Last year, fifteen counselors helped 5,612 families with emergency needs such as heat, rent, shelter, doctors visits and funerals. While the average request was a seemingly modest \$246, Catholic Charities had enough funds to help only 20% of those who sought assistance. Because the Annual Catholic Appeal helps cover operating expenses, 100% of this collections will directly help neighbors in need.
