MONDAY, DECEMBER 8 - is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and a Holy Day of Obligation. Please note: The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has stated that a Vigil Mass for the Holy Day CANNOT be celebrated on Sunday, December 7. The schedule of Masses for Monday December 8 is: 8:00AM and 5:30PM.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK will take place at the 4:00PM Mass on Saturday, December 7 and the 7:30AM & 9:30AM Masses on Sunday, December 7. According to Church guidelines this sacrament is available to Catholics who have: reached the age of reason and begin to fall in danger of death as a result of illness or old age; who are undergoing surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery; who are elderly if they have been notably weakened even though there is no serious illness present; sick children if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament. We will celebrate this Sacrament of the Sick during Mass so that the gathered community can pray for our sisters and brothers who are being anointed.

SECOND COLLECTION this weekend, November 22 & 23 will take place for Catholic Charities of Altoona-Johnstown. Since 1940, Catholic Charities has helped our neighbors throughout central Pennsylvania regardless of faith or background. Last year, fifteen counselors helped 5,612 families with emergency needs such as heat, rent, shelter, doctors visits and funerals. While the average request was a seemingly modest \$246, Catholic Charities had enough funds to help only 20% of those who sought assistance. Because the Annual Catholic Appeal helps cover operating expenses, 100% of this collections will directly help neighbors in need.
