**FROM THE BISHOP** – Because of the seriousness of this flu season, Bishop Bartchak has asked that the Precious Blood of the Lord not be offered at Mass temporarily. It is the belief of the Catholic Church that the whole Body of Christ is present under either form of consecrated bread and wine. Also, the exchange of the sign of peace should avoid bodily contact. A reverent nod with eye contact and a smile will be the temporary practice. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand is encouraged; however, reception on the tongue may not be denied. These norms are in effect throughout the winter months or until the flu season is over.

**The Role of Deacons** - All ordained ministers (Bishop, Priest, Deacon) act *in persona Christi* – that is, in the person of Christ – and solely by Christ's power and authority, not their own.

A Deacon is an ordained cleric and, just as Bishops and Priests, he is ordained to Holy Orders in order to serve the People of God. There are two types of Deacons: permanent and transitional. A transitional Deacon is on the path to Priestly ordination, whereas a permanent Deacon – who is usually married – will not be ordained a Priest. Only the Bishop can administer all of the Sacraments; a Priest ordinarily administers all of the Sacraments except Holy Orders and Confirmation. Confirmation maybe administered by a Priest only with special permission of the Bishop, e.g., Holy Saturday. A Deacon can administer Baptism and assist at marriages, but he cannot administer the Sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick, Penance, the Eucharist, Holy Orders or Confirmation.

Typically, a permanent Deacon is assigned to assist the pastor of a parish, just as a Priest is ordained to help the Bishop. The Bishop makes the assignment of the Deacon, and it is usually for a period of six to twelve years. The Deacon can distribute Holy Communion, preach the homily, assist at Masses and celebrate Baptisms, weddings and funerals. Depending on his availability, he can do much more than Sacramental work: he can visit the sick, the elderly, shut-ins; he can organize assistance for the poor and promote visits to those in prison; he can organize Catholic education classes for members of the Parish.

But the most important contribution a Deacon can make is his own personal holiness. A Deacon must strive to be a man of prayer, poor in spirit; clean in thought, word and action; and an example of humility within the Church. He must be a faithful husband and a caring father. It the Deacon is not a man of prayer, truly humble and united to the Lord and Bishops of the Church, then he will not be helpful.
