

FROM THE BISHOP – Because of the seriousness of this flu season, Bishop Bartchak has asked that the Precious Blood of the Lord not be offered at Mass temporarily. It is the belief of the Catholic Church that the whole Body of Christ is present under either form of Consecrated Bread and Wine. Also, the exchange of the Sign of Peace should avoid bodily contact. A reverent nod with eye contact and a smile will be the temporary practice. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand is encouraged; however, reception on the tongue may not be denied. These norms are in effect throughout the winter months or until the flu season is over.

Stewardship Reflection...All three readings today speak of repenting – the act of changing our hearts and minds for the better. If we find ourselves succumbing to dominant secular culture that often contradicts values of the Judeo-Christian tradition, we only need to "repent" by making a conscious decision of becoming disciples of Jesus Christ, no matter what the cost.

Gospel Reflection... Leave your job and family. Follow Jesus, not alone, but with others. Repent. Accept and live the message that the Kingdom of God is at hand. These are summary statements of the call to discipleship found in Mark. We, like the first Disciples, come after Jesus, believing that in Him God's Kingdom is present. This is the Kingdom we proclaim to the world by virtue of our Baptism and our repentance.
