

FROM THE BISHOP – Because of the seriousness of this flu season, Bishop Bartchak has asked that the Precious Blood of the Lord not be offered at Mass temporarily. It is the belief of the Catholic Church that the whole Body of Christ is present under either form of Consecrated Bread and Wine. Also, the exchange of the Sign of Peace should avoid bodily contact. A reverent nod with eye contact and a smile will be the temporary practice. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand is encouraged; however, reception on the tongue may not be denied. These norms are in effect throughout the winter months or until the flu season is over.

Gospel Reflection... At the conclusion of last Sunday's Gospel we heard of the rapid expansion of Jesus' reputation based on His healing of the man with an unclean spirit. Today's Gospel is another passage about healing which begins with the individual healing of Simon's mother-in-law and then narrates the healing of many in the entire town. After doing this work, Jesus prays alone in a deserted place, yet Simon and the others follow Him, telling Him that everyone is looking for Him. Jesus knows He must continue to preach and heal, and so He goes forth from His short-lived place of solitude.

Families and the Gospel...Mk 1:29-39 – Jesus went to the "house of Andrew and Simon" to relax but discovered that Simon's mother-in-law was very ill. Like Jesus we come home to relax but are confronted with problems. Take a tip from Andrew and Simon who "told Jesus about it at once."

FROM MSGR. TIMOTHY SWOPE – On May 6, 2015, I will be leading a tour to the Holy Land from Loretto. We will fly out of Pittsburgh and arrive in Tel Aviv on the 7th. Booking the tour soon, for the nine days will cost \$4049.00. This includes airfare, hotels, breakfast and dinners, expert tour director and local guides, and of course daily Mass at the sites. Included are sites like the Church of the Annunciation; Mount of Beatitudes; Transfiguration; the Way of the Cross; Holy Sepulchre and many more. An optional excursion will be offered to Masada and the Dead Sea; and Jerusalem at Night. An extension to Petra and beyond is also available.
