Liturgical Reflection... The Local Church of Altoona-Johnstown will assemble on Monday of Holy Week, March 30, at 11:00AM in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament for the annual Chrism Mass. Bishop Mark will gather with his college of Priests assisted by his Deacons with the assembled faithful from throughout the Diocese. Bishop Mark will bless the Oil of the Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick, and Sacred Chrism. These consecrated oils will be used for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick; also new altars will be consecrated with Sacred Chrism. Each parish community will take a portion of the three oils back to the parish for use in the appropriate liturgical celebrations. Matthew 27:35 – When they had crucified Him, they divided His garments, rolling dice for them to see what each should take.

Luke 23:24 – They divided His garments, rolling dice for them.

John 19:23-24 – After the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took His garments and divided them each soldier.
