REFLECTION

How important is trust to you? Most teenagers will answer, "Someone I trust," when asked what quality they feel is most important in a friend. Other qualities that hit high on the list are loyalty, honesty, sincerity—all qualities related to trust. If you've ever been betrayed then you know all too well how

important trust is. Who are the people in your life right now that you really trust? Are they people you've known for a while? Trust takes time to build and you usually have to get to know someone pretty well before you feel like you can trust them. Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd in today's Gospel. He says he knows us, that he is someone we can count on, someone we can trust.

ACTION
