
REFLECTION

Imagine you've just gotten back from a mission trip with your youth group. You've had a great week helping people but you're physically and emotionally exhausted. You pull in the parking lot ready to

get home for a shower and a serious nap when you see them: the people you helped. They were so inspired by your work, your faith, the example you set, that they've followed you home. Not only that, they've brought along their friends and relatives, 5,000 of them! That's the scenario that the Apostles face in today's Gospel. Last week we heard the story of Jesus sending them out to preach with nothing but the clothes on their backs. In today's Gospel they come back with sunburns and blisters and stories to tell, so Jesus invites them to come away with him to rest. The crowds have gathered and Jesus sees that they need him. He doesn't get back in the boat and go find another beach that's less crowded. He does what needs doing. He teaches them about the love God.
