REFLECTION

Aside from the necessary love and support found in families, friendships are the most important relationships to all of us—no matter our age. Have you ever wondered what kind of friends Jesus had growing up or how he acted as a friend toward others? Do you think he preached lofty pieces of wisdom to his peers, or did he act more normally? Today's Second Reading is rich in love from St. Paul to those in Phillippi. Whenever I read the first line, I smile and think how blessed I am to have certain relationships and how I love to support, encourage, and remind my friends of how amazing they are. Who are those friends in your life for whom you can say: "I am confident that the one who began a good work in you (a.k.a. God!) will continue to complete it"? Just as much as we need others to remind us of our strengths, we too need to be people who reflect the light of Christ to our friends and family. St. Paul continues to talk about being "pure and blameless for the day of Christ" (Philippians 1:10). That is not easy in our society. There are too many temptations; too many options to be led astray. Our friends help ground us and can help us witness the way of Christ, even without words.

ACTION
