The ordained Priest wears a stole and chasuble unique to his liturgical role. The ordained Deacon wears a stole (over his left shoulder) and a dalmatic. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, altar servers may wear an alb of some appropriately dignified clothing. Other liturgical ministers wear clothes befitting the sacred rites.
