REFLECTION

This Sunday's First Reading tells us about the anointing of David, which was a rite involving the smearing of oil on his forehead and hands (similar to Confirmation or Holy Orders today). The Gospel is the story of the man born blind and healed when Jesus smeared mud on his eyes. If we were to read more about David's story, we'd hear how he became King of Israel and was a favorite of God for many

years. In the Gospel, we hear the blind man steadfastly witnessing to Jesus even in the face of difficulty. These two men are both transformed by God through an act of anointing.

If we, too, want to live as transformed people, then we must be true to the glimpses of God we are blessed enough to see. When we are anointed, such as in Baptism and Confirmation, the Spirit refreshes us to act as children of the light. When we seek out and experience Jesus, we are given the Spirit to live with goodness and truth and to go forth and evangelize.
