
## DECEMBER 20, 2015 Fourth Sunday of Advent THE FAITH COMMUNITY OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

**Marriage In** accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

*St. Francis and the Christmas Creche*...St. Francis of Assisi began the tradition of recreating the Nativity scene as a way of sharing the story of our Savior's birth with people who were not able to read the story. Here is the story as told by St. Bonaventure in his Life of St. Francis of Assisi: "It happened in the third year before his death, that in order to excite the inhabitants of Grecio to commemorate the Nativity of the Infant Jesus with great devotion, [St. Francis] determined to keep it with all possible solemnity; and lest he should be accused of lightness or novelty, he asked and obtained the permission of the sovereign Pontiff. Then he prepared a manger, and brought hay, and an ox and an ass to the place appointed. The brethren were summoned, the people ran together, the forest resounded with their voices, and that venerable night was made

glorious by many and brilliant lights and sonorous psalms of praise. The man of God [St. Francis] stood before the manger, full of devotion and piety, bathed in tears and radiant with joy; the Holy Gospel was chanted by Francis, the Levite of Christ. Then he preached to the people around the Nativity of the poor King; and being unable to utter His Name for the tenderness of His love, He called Him the Babe of Bethlehem."

**BIBLE STUDY to FOCUS on the YEAR OF MERCY – THEOLOGY of DIVINE MERCY** – From the diary of a young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930s. The message is nothing new, but it is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through Scripture and traditions: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding

that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone – especially the greatest sinners. The message and devotion to Jesus as **The Divine Mercy** is based on the writings of St. Faustina Kowalska. The first session will include the viewing of the award winning film "Faustina: Apostle of Divine Mercy (Polish with English subtitles)."
