Feast of the Epiphany

The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt. Matthew's Gospel tells a version of Jesus' birth that is different from the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us little more than, "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod..." The story of the census is found only in Luke's Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel. We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel, they present the Gentile's search for a Savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus. We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' Kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of His Divinity because Priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death. The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including His birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, His Baptism by John, and His first miracle at Cana.

Families and the Gospel...Mt 2:1-12 – After meeting Jesus, the Magi returned home by "another way." What in your family needs to be done another way? Do you need another way to resolve differences, to communicate or show affection? This is a new year, time to change what isn't working. Take a tip from some wise men, there's always "another way."

Family Ritual... Were the Wise Men really wise? Were they wise because they possessed a wealth of earthly knowledge? Or were they wise because they understood that even while having all of the world's knowledge, something more was beckoning them to make the journey to the newborn King? Are we wise enough to hear the voice of God calling in our lives and, if so, do we have the courage to follow?

BIBLE STUDY to FOCUS on the YEAR OF MERCY – THEOLOGY of DIVINE MERCY – From the diary of a young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930s. The message is nothing new, but it is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through Scripture and traditions: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone – especially the greatest sinners. The first session will include the viewing of the award winning film "Faustina: Apostle of Divine Mercy (Polish with English subtitles)."
