
# FEBRUARY 21, 2016 Second Sunday of Lent THE FAITH COMMUNITY OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

**Reconciliation** – The Sacrament of God's merciful love and compassion is celebrated Tues at 6 PM and Sat 3:15 PM at St. Francis of Assisi. Communal Penance Services - Advent and Lent.

Anointing of the Sick Communal – Celebration 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent.

**Marriage In** accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

**SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK** will take place at the 4:00PM Mass on Saturday, February 27 and the 7:30Am & 9:30AM Masses on Sunday, February 28. According to Church guidelines this sacrament is available to Catholics who have: reached the age of reason and begin to fall in danger of death as a result of illness or old age; who are undergoing surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery; who are elderly if they have been notably weakened even though there is no serious illness present; sick children if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this Sacrament. We will celebrate this Sacrament of the Sick during Mass so that the gathered community can pray for our sisters and brothers who are being anointed.

*Liturgical Reflection*... The second week of Lent the Local Church observes the Corporal Work of Mercy to **shelter the homeless.** The media bombards us with information on the flight of immigrants seeking a homeland. *Families and the Gospel*...February 21 – Luke 9:28b-36 – Jesus "went up to the mountain to pray" and He was "changed." Prayer has the power to change us. This Lent set aside a few minutes each day to pray for members of your family. Pray before each meal and if you are married, spend five minutes in prayer together.

*Stewardship Reflection*...By choosing to allow Jesus Christ to transform their lives, Christian stewards and disciples recognize that their ultimate "citizenship is in Heaven" (Phil 3:20).

#### SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS



During the Second Week of Lent, a WHIP is placed at the Cross to remind us that before Jesus was crucified, He underwent a brutal scourging. Whips were used which tore into His flesh causing wounds to bleed. He allowed this to happen for you and me. With Our Sorrowful Mother we pray: BRUISED, DERIDED CURSED, DEFILED, SHE BEHELD HER TENDER CHILD, ALL WITH BLOODY SCOURGES RENT.

Matthew 27:26 - At that he (Pilate) released Barabbas to them. Jesus, however, he first SCOURGED, then he handed Him over to be crucified.

Mark 15:15 – So Pilate, who wished to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas to them and after he had Jesus SCOURGED, he handed Him over to be crucified.

Luke 23:22 – He said to them a third time, "What is this man guilty of? I have not discovered anything about Him that calls for the death penalty. I will therefore chastise Him and release Him."

John 19 – Pilate's next move was to take Jesus and have Him SCOURGED.
