SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS



During the Third Week of Lent, NAILS are fastened to "that Old Rugged Cross" on which Our Lord and Savior was nailed to remind us that it was for our sins that He was nailed to the Cross. Can you imagine what a crucifixion is? Jesus' thoughts: "My executioners stretch My arms; they hold My hand and wrist against the wood and press the nail until it stabs My flesh. Then with one heavy hammer smash, they drive it through and pain bursts like a bomb of fire in My brain. They seize the other arm and agony again explodes. Then raising My knees so that My feet are flat against the wood, they hammer them fast too."

My God, I look at You and think – is my soul worth this much? What can I give You in return? I here and now accept for all my life whatever comes my way. To every Cross, I touch my lips and kiss Your nailed hands and feet. To CRUCIFY, according to Webster's Seventh Collegiate Dictionary, means, "To put to death by

NAILING or binding the hands and feet to a cross." The four Gospels do not specifically say that Jesus was nailed to a cross, but each Gospel says that they led Him out to crucify Him. Gospel references: Matthew 27:33-36; Mark 15:22-26; Luke 23:33-34 and John 19:16-18. WHY A SKULL AT THE BASE OF THE CROSS? Matthew 27:33-34; Mark 15:22; Luke 23:33 and John 19:17-18.
