Liturgical Reflection...On the Seventh Sunday of Easter we look at the Spiritual Work of Mercy to **forgive injuries.** A follower of Christ is called not only to forgive, but to forgive generously. This act of mercy can be extremely challenging. Forgiveness is a divine gift rooted in the mercy of God. From a human perspective forgiveness can sometimes be more than challenging. Hurt and anger sometimes lead to thoughts of revenge and hate. On the Cross, Jesus forgave His trespassers. To those who hurt us and offend us, we offer mercy. To those who show no remorse or accept no responsibility for causing injury, we offer mercy. Many times we must turn to the Lord of mercy to forgive the injuries we ourselves have caused.
