

REFLECTION

After I graduated from college, I chose to do a year of full-time service in Denver, Colorado. During that time, I volunteered for forty hours per week and was given a meager allowance for rent, and a food budget for my community of ten. That year was one of the most formative years of my life, but it was certainly not an easy decision to go against the norm. While my parents eventually supported my decision, their first choice was for me to get a "real job" and start making money. I had to make the tough choice to follow what Christ was calling me to do, despite my parents' hesitations. In today's Gospel, when Christ calls us to hate our families, what he means is that we need to put God's will above everything else in life, even the people we care about most. Discipleship is certainly not easy!



ACTION

Choosing to put Christ first and being a disciple is quite radical and countercultural. Fortunately, we have many great examples of what it means to
