
# NOVEMBER 27, 2016 First Sunday of Advent THE FAITH COMMUNITY OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

**THANK YOU** to all who have participated in the Annual Catholic Appeal. According to Church guidelines this Sacrament is available to all Catholics who have: reached the age of reason and begin to fall in danger of death as a result of illness or old age; who are undergoing surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery; who are elderly if they have been noticeably weakened even though there is no serious illness present; sick children if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this Sacrament. We will celebrate this Sacrament of the Sick during Mass so that the gathered community can pray for our sisters and brothers who are being anointed.

*Liturgical Reflection*.... The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops has directed the use of the revised Order of Celebrating Matrimony. The former rite was initially issued in 1969 following the Second Vatican Council. The Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown begins the use of the revised ritual beginning this first week of Advent. Workshops have occurred throughout the Diocese for clergy and liturgical musicians. The liturgical inserts will reflect on the theology of Matrimony, the gift of married couples to the Church, and the different aspects of the revised ritual.
