

REFLECTION

The Blessed Mother is a model and exemplar of our faith. She shines as the ultimate example of how God's desire works through the most unexpected of means and people. Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. As a new calendar year ushers in, we pause to reflect upon this young woman who said "yes!" to God's plan. Place yourself in the story we hear from Luke's account of the Gospel today. Shepherds rush to find Mary and Joseph with the infant. They share the exciting news that the angels had shared with them and that they have now seen with their own eyes. The Messiah has come in the person of this newborn child. Ancient hope was now being realized in Jesus' birth. Amazement was the response of others who heard this message, while "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19). There is a depth to Mary's response in this passage, as the heart symbolizes the spiritual center of a person. May we too, on this solemnity and throughout Christmas Time, take God's revelation into our hearts and be transformed.

ACTION
