SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS



During the First Week of Lent, a CROWN OF THORNS is placed on the cross to remind us that Jesus was crucified. He was crowned with of crown of thorns as a King "of a Kingdom that is not of this world" (John 18:36). The thorns were embedded in the head of Jesus causing excruciating pain. He allowed this to happen for you and me. My heart hears the stanza of the hymn WHEN I BEHOLD THE WONDROUS CROSS "Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown."

Matthew 27:30 – Weaving a CROWN out of THORNS they fixed it on His head, and stuck a reed in His right hand. Then they began to mock Him by dropping to their knees before Him saying, "All hail the King of the Jews."

Mark 15:17-18 – They dressed Him in royal purple, then wove a CROWN OF THORNS and put it on Him and began to salute Him, "All hail, King of the Jews."

John 19:2-3 – The soldiers then wove a CROWN OF THORNS and fixed it on His head, throwing around His shoulders a cloak of royal purple. Repeatedly they came up to Him and said, "All hail, King of the Jews, slapping His face as they did so.

THERE is a large black bag in the main vestibule for used palms.
