SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS



During the Second Week of Lent, a WHIP is placed at the Cross to remind us that before Jesus was crucified, He underwent a brutal scourging. Whips were used which tore into His flesh causing wounds to bleed. He allowed this to happen for you and me. With Our Sorrowful Mother we pray: BRUISED, DERIDED, CURSED, DEFILED, SHE BEHELD HER TENDER CHILD, ALL WITH BLOODY SCOURGES RENT.

Matthew 27:26 - At that he (Pilate) released Barabbas to them. Jesus, however, he first SCOURGED, then he handed Him over to be crucified.

Mark 15:15 – So Pilate, who wished to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas to them and after he had Jesus SCOURGED, he handed Him over to be crucified.

Luke 23:22 – He said to them a third time, "What is this man guilty of? I have not discovered anything about Him that calls for the death penalty. I will therefore chastise Him and release Him."

John 19 – Pilate's next move was to take Jesus and have Him SCOURGED.
