Liturgical Reflection... An opening song can accompany the Introductory Rites to Marriage within Mass and without Mass. An option is to have the Priest or Deacon enter in the customary manner (as at Sunday Mass) to the opening song. The servers, readers, and Priest or Deacon enter to this hymn. Or, if already at the chair, following the informal welcome of the bride and groom, an entrance chant follows. The purpose of the song is to gather those present for the celebration of Marriage and prepare them for the commemoration of the coming mysteries of Faith.
