Reconciliation – The Sacrament of God’s merciful love and compassion is celebrated Tues at 6 PM and Sat 3:15 PM at St. Francis of Assisi. Communal Penance Services - Advent and Lent.

Anointing of the Sick Communal – Celebration 2nd Sunday of Advent and 3rd Sunday of Lent.

Marriage in accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

Christian Initiation (RCIA) – Those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who are interested in learning more about their Catholic Faith, may call the Parish office for more information.

Parish Membership – We are always happy to welcome new parishioners. You may register at the Parish office. Registration, the practice of stewardship (the regular use of envelopes) and regular participation in the Eucharist indicates active membership and eligibility to act as a Godparent or Sponsor. 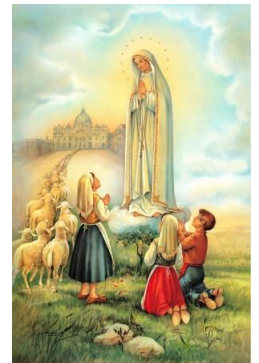
SANCTUARY CANDLE will burn this week for Special Intention for Francis Ozog by Jim & Sue Ellen Dadey.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO OUR PARISH LAST WEEKEND: Loose - \$486.00; Adults - \$2,925.27; Children - \$26.00; Monthly - \$733.02; Candles - \$34.25; Peter Pence -- \$25.00; Missalettes - \$144.04; St. Vincent de Paul - \$10.00; Mission Appeal - \$100.00; Misc. - \$285.17. Total Collection - \$4,768.75. 170 out of 314 families used envelopes. Thank you for your continued generosity to the parish.

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES DRIVE (formerly known as the Annual Catholic Appeal) has now begun. While each parish is asked to achieve a “target” amount, unlike other years the parish will not be assessed if its target is not reached. *The target amount for St. Francis of Assisi is \$18,608.00 which breaks down to \$59.26 per family.* Contributions exceeding the target will be refunded to the parish. Total received as of June 26: 57 of 314 families contributed \$6,435.25 which is 34% of our goal. Let’s keep working to meet the Parish goal. Liturgical Reflection... Within Mass and without Mass, the Priest or Deacon begins with the Sign of the Cross and greeting. The revised ritual provides two options (“in these or similar words”) to address the couple and those present to dispose them inwardly for the celebration of Marriage. When celebrating Matrimony within Mass, the Church directs there is no Penitential Rite. There is to be the *Glory to God* (preferably sung) at the Mass celebrating Matrimony. This hymn of praise to the glory of God is directed even in the Seasons of Advent and Lent when the ritual Mass for Marriage is celebrated. All in the assembly, gathered for the Sacrament of Matrimony, are encouraged to take part in this beautiful prayer of praise. The collect (six options) concludes the Introductory Rites. 2017, *Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown, Liturgy Office, 925 S. Logan Blvd., Hollidaysburg, PA 16648.*

Stewardship Reflection... Today’s psalmist signs with joy “Let all Your works give You thanks, O Lord, and let Your faithful ones bless You.” A steward’s way of life is grounded in giving thanks, living with an “attitude of gratitude.”

Families and the Gospel – July 9 – Matthew 11:25-30 – Today’s Gospel is about missionaries. As Jesus received a mission today, parents accept the mission of raising a family. Parents are not alone in this exhausting and difficult mission. Today Jesus tells us “Come to Me and I will give you rest.”
