ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI YOUTH FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS— Our Faith Formation Goals are simple: We aim to grow in love of God and ourselves and to spread that love to those around us. We aim to have our young people find community with each other and feel part of our parish family. Faith formation is life long and ongoing. It is an important part of your child's life. She/he should be attending classes whether or not it is a Sacramental year. All classes meet in Resurrection Parish Center on Chestnut St. Classes for our youth are held from September 10 until the beginning of May. Pre-K through eighth grade classes meet Sunday after the 9:30AM Mass until Noon. 9th AND 10th CONFIRMATION CLASSES WILL ALSO TAKE PLACE ON SUNDAY at the Resurrection Oratory from after the 9:30AM Mass until Noon. THE 11th GRADE CONFIRMATION CLASS will meet the second Sunday of each month at the Rectory from 6:00PM – 8:00PM. REGISTRATION FORMS CAN BE FOUND IN THE VESTIBULE OF THE CHURCH. Sacramental preparation and celebration of the Sacraments of Penance / Reconciliation, First Eucharist, and Confirmation is to be parish based and family inclusive. It is presumed that candidates and their parents participate weekly at Sunday Mass at their parish. Parish based sacramental preparation is in addition to education in either the Catholic School or home schooling.

THE DIOCESE OF ALTOONA-JOHNSTOWN, is sponsoring a Catholic Life Day of Reflection. It is scheduled for Saturday, September 30, 2017, in the Bertschi Center at Mount Aloysius College in Cresson, from 8:00AM until 12:30PM. The theme for this day of reflection is, "The Virtue of Magnanimity." The day will begin with the celebration of Eucharist at 8:30AM with Bishop Mark Bartchak as the main celebrant, then a coffee break, followed with the keynote presentation by Bishop Mark. A continental breakfast will be offered after the keynote. The day concludes with a reflection experience on Hope facilitated by Msgr. Robert C. Mazur. Registration forms are available in the vestibule or at the Parish Office. Deadline for registration is September 22.

Liturgical Reflection... When celebrating the Sacrament of Matrimony with Mass, the order of the rite is: Liturgy of the Word, the Celebration of Matrimony, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Once the Celebration of Matrimony is completed, the preparation of the altar and gifts follows. The Rite suggests that the bride and bridegroom may bring the bread and wine to the altar. Other possibilities would be family or friends. The couple can ask their Godparents to bring up the gifts. Once all in ready on the altar, Mass proceeds in the usual manner.
