Reconciliation – The Sacrament of God’s merciful love and compassion is celebrated Tues at 6 PM and Sat 3:15 PM at St. Francis of Assisi. Communal Penance Services - Advent and Lent.

Anointing of the Sick Communal – Celebration 2nd Sunday of Advent and 3rd Sunday of Lent.

Marriage in accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

Christian Initiation (RCIA) – Those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who are interested in learning more about their Catholic Faith, may call the Parish office for more information.

Parish Membership – We are always happy to welcome new parishioners. You may register at the Parish office. Registration, the practice of stewardship (the regular use of envelopes) and regular participation in the Eucharist indicates active membership and eligibility to act as a Godparent or Sponsor. Your stewardship of time, treasure and talent is essential for the common good and provides a stable income for the Parish, enabling us to prepare a budget.

The gift cards can be placed in the collection basket (please do not place them under the tree) or brought to the Parish Office. There will also be the Angel Baby Tree in the vestibule by the bassinet. Gifts for the Gabriel Project should be returned **No Later than Sunday, December 3, 2017**.

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES DRIVE (formerly known as the Annual Catholic Appeal) is now continuing. *The target amount for St. Francis of Assisi is \$18,608.00 which breaks down to \$59.26 per family.* Contributions exceeding the target will be refunded to the parish. Total received as of September 30: 75 of 314 families contributed \$9,867.00 which is 53% of our goal. Let's keep working to meet the Parish goal. Thanks to all who have contributed to help meet the goal.

WONDERFUL JOB in giving food to those who need it. To date, having started in mid-February, the Parish has given 2,068 pounds of food to St. Vincent DePaul Soup Kitchen. Add the 500 pounds collected for the Thanksgiving drive and that totals 2, 568! If we really pitch in, we could donate 432 pounds the rest of the year and total 3,000 pounds. That would be 1 ½ tons of food! Game on?
