SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK – will take place at the 4:00PM Mass on Saturday, December 9 and at the 7:30AM & 9:30AM Masses on Sunday, December 10. According to Church guidelines this Sacrament is available to all Catholics who have reached the age of reason and begin to fall in danger of death as a result of illness or old age; who are undergoing surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery; who are elderly if they have been noticeably weakened even though there is no serious illness present; sick children if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this Sacrament. We will celebrate this Sacrament of the Sick during Mass so that the gathered community can pray for our sisters and brothers who are being anointed.

Advent is a time of hopeful anticipation as we prepare to celebrate the remembrance of the Lord's first coming and, also, recalling his final coming in glory at the end of time. As we celebrate our Funeral Rites, the goal is to bring hope to the living. We turn to the Lord of life at the time of death to find assurance in our Faith. We turn to the God of mercy in time of crisis and pain. To those who mourn and grieve, there is reason to have hope. Stewardship Reflection...It is through repentance that we acknowledge our sins. In their pastoral letter on stewardship, the U.S. Bishops proclaim that "the Spirit of wisdom and courage helps people seek pardon and be mindful that in the face of all their forgetting, the most important work of their lives is to be Jesus' disciples." As we prepare to celebrate God's greatest gift to us in the birth of our Savior, have we reconciled our sins so as to continue along the path to Eternal Life?

Families and the Gospel – December 10 – Mark 1:1-8 – Why is it so hard to forgive, yet so easy to get even? Listen to John the Baptist in today's Gospel and repent of the anger and ugly feelings which block your ability to forgive. This Christmas give a gift which makes a difference. Give forgiveness.

Grow in Prayer – Our prayer life can mature and grow when we pray for intentions that are outside ourselves. For example, we can pray for the victims of war, the sick, for the people who don't believe in God, and for those in jails and prisons, whether we know them or not.
