Liturgical Reflection...The Catholic believer is usually assisted with three distinct prayers at the time of death. The Church initially gathers with the family at the **Vigil for the Deceased.** This prayer is grounded in Holy Scripture. The central prayer at the time of death is the **Funeral Mass.** At the funeral liturgy the deceased is given over to the mercy of God. We gather celebrating the Sacred Mysteries of the Lord's Death and Resurrection, asking that our beloved dead rest in the peace of Christ.
