*Liturgical Reflection*...We stand with Thomas today to make one of the greatest professions of Faith in Scripture to Jesus Christ, "My Lord, and My God!" Thomas comes face to face with the Risen Christ. The celebration of the Christian funeral brings hope and consolation to the living. When a Christian dies we proclaim the Gospel Jesus Christ with certainty and witness to Christian hope in the Resurrection. The Funeral Rites recall God's mercy and judgment and meet the human need to turn always to God in times of crisis. Death has lost its power. We live in the mercy of God, in the risen life of the Easter Jesus.

*Stewardship Reflection*...In his first encyclical, Pope Benedict XVI states that "Only if I serve my neighbor can my eyes be opened to what God does for me and how much He loves me." On this Divine Mercy Sunday, practice Christian stewardship (serve others) through works of mercy and reconciliation.
