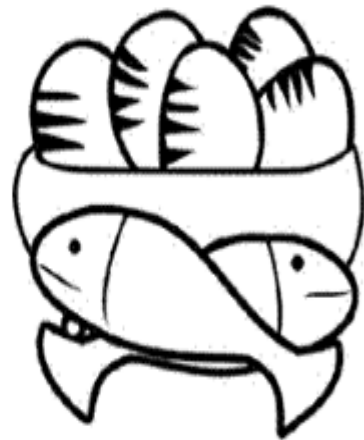

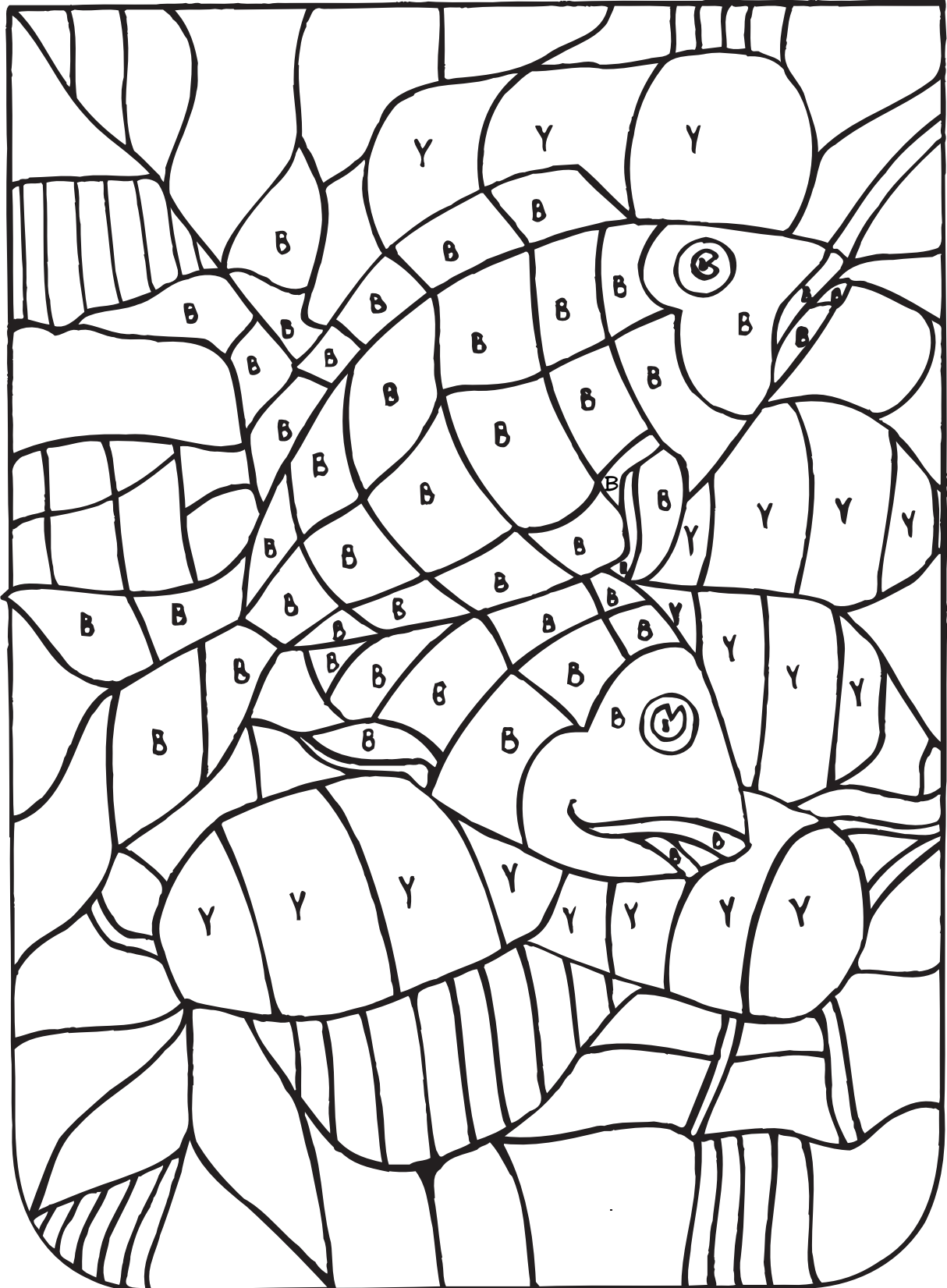

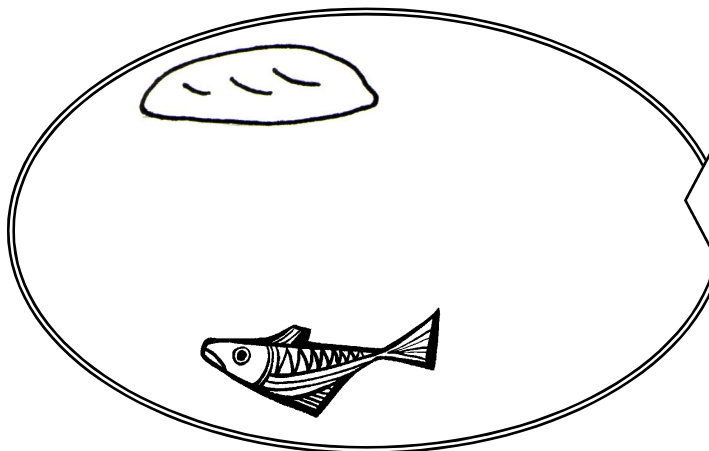


JESUS GIVES US FOOD
