

Stewardship Reflection...In today's first reading, the ancient Israelites are asked to rejoice in the Lord for His abundant food, and to give a portion to those who had nothing. As Christian stewards, we are called to do the same. The U.S. Bishops' Pastoral on stewardship reinforces today's reading from 1 Corinthians: "Because its individual members do collectively make up the Body of Christ, that body's health and well-being are the responsibility of the members – the personal responsibility of each one of us. We are all stewards of the Church" (Our Sunday Visitor, ibid., page 28).



ST. JOHN VIANNEY RELIC PILGRIMAGE The Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown has been selected as one of the stops in the national St. John Vianney Relic Pilgrimage. The Incorrupt Heart of St. John Vianney, Patron Saint of Priests, will be present at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament in Altoona on January 31. The faithful will have the extraordinary opportunity to venerate the relic throughout the day between 7:30AM and a 7:30PM. The Cathedral's usual daily Mass schedule – 6:45AM; 8:00AM, and Noon – will remain in place with the addition of a concelebrated Mass at 5:30PM with Bishop Mark presiding. Priests will be available throughout the day to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A special indulgence has been granted to all those who will make the pilgrimage to the Cathedral for veneration of the first class relic of St. John Vianney, Patron of Priests.
