DID YOU NOTICE THE PURPLE FOOTSTEPS? – In the Gospel passage from Luke we encounter a teaching on discipleship. As disciples of Jesus we need to keep Him first in our lives. Work, obligations, friendships, social engagements and hobbies are all good things but they need to be placed in their proper context in our lives. Jesus must be central. Jesus teaches us that follow to Him we must follow Him to Jerusalem. Taking up His Cross in our lives, as He reminded us is a "daily" activity. Discipleship continually entails a laying down of our lives in love of God and other human beings. We are encouraged to follow Jesus and to follow Him all the way to Jerusalem as we walk in His footprints to Calvary.

What are you doing for Lent this year?

Ask Catholics what they're doing for Lent this year, and they'll probably tell you that they are giving up a favorite food, a favorite pastime or anything else they really love but isn't essential in their lives. Giving up something for Lent fosters self-discipline and tempers our desires. It is a form of fasting. It is a form of penance. It promotes spiritual growth. If you're giving up something for Lent, that's great. But think also of the possibility of doing

something positive to bolster your spiritual life (*silent prayer or meditation*) and make the world a better place (be kind, go out of your way every day to do something nice for someone). Look for ways that you can increase your knowledge of your Faith, strengthen your spiritual life (*read a book about the Saints, take part in ARISE*!) or perform special acts of mercy and kindness at home, at work, in your parish (*how about helping at the Fish Fry?*) or in your community.

PLEASE TAKE ONE OF THE CIRCLES located at the entrances to the Church, write **YOUR** Lenten resolution on it and place on the tree in the Sanctuary. Each time you come to Mass you will be reminded of what you are doing to make this a holy Lent.

SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS

During the First Week of Lent, a CROWN OF THORNS is placed on the cross to remind us that Jesus was crucified. He was crowned with a crown of crown of thorns as a King "of a Kingdom that is not of this world" (John 18:36). The thorns were embedded in the head of Jesus causing excruciating pain. He allowed this to happen for you and me. My heart hears the stanza of the hymn WHEN I BEHOLD THE WONDROUS CROSS "Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown?"



Matthew 27:30 – Weaving a CROWN out of THORNS they fixed it on His head, and stuck a reed in His right hand. Then they began to mock Him by dropping to their knees before Him saying, "All hail the King of the Jews."

Mark 15:17-18 – They dressed Him in royal purple, then wove a CROWN OF THORNS and put it on Him and began to salute Him, "All hail, King of the Jews."

John 19:2-3 – The soldiers then wove a CROWN OF THORNS and fixed it on His head, throwing around His shoulders a cloak of royal purple. Repeatedly they came up to Him and said, "All hail, King of the Jews, slapping His face as they did so.
