

Marriage in accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

Christian Initiation (RCIA) – Those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who are interested in learning more about their Catholic Faith, may call the Parish office for more information.

Solemnity of Corpus Christi

While they were eating, He took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said "Take it, this is My Body." Then He took cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is My Blood of the Covenant, which will be shed for many."

Where the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is not observed as a Holy Day, it is assigned to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday, which is then considered its proper day in the calendar.

Corpus Christi (Body and Blood of Christ) is a Eucharistic Solemnity, or better, the solemn commemoration of the institution of the Sacrament. It is, moreover, the Church's official act of homage and gratitude to Christ, Who by instituting the Holy Eucharist, gave to the Church her greatest treasure. Holy Thursday, assuredly, marks the anniversary of the institution, but the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion that very night suppresses the rejoicing proper to the occasion. Today's observance, therefore, accents the joyous aspect of Holy Thursday. The Mass and the Office for the Feast was edited or composed by St. Thomas Aquinas upon the request of Pope Urban IV in the year 1264. It is unquestionably a classic piece of liturgical work, wholly in accord with the best liturgical traditions. It is a perfect work of art.

Prayer of St. Thomas Aquinas

Lord, Father all-powerful, and ever-living God, I thank Thee, for even though I am a sinner, Thy unprofitable servant, not because of my worth, but in the kindness of Thy mercy, Thou hast fed me with the precious Body and Blood of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that this Holy Communion may not bring condemnation and punishment but forgiveness and salvation. May it be a helmet of Faith and a shield of good will. May it purify me from evil ways and put an end to my evil passions. May it bring me charity and patience, humility and obedience and growth in power to do good. May it be my strong defense against all my enemies, visible and invisible, and the perfect calming of all my evil impulses, bodily and spiritual. May it unite me more closely to Thee, the one true God and lead me safely through death to everlasting happiness with Thee. And I pray that Thou willest lead me, a sinner to the banquet where Thou with Thy Son and Holy Spirit, art true and perfect light, total fulfillment, everlasting joy, gladness without end, and perfect happiness to Thy Saints. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
