

Marriage in accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT THE LACK OF VOCATIONS TO THE PRIESTHOOD? THEN READ ON!

VOCATION CRUCIFIX- A special Crucifix that travels from family to family or household to household ordinarily for 1 week or longer to inspire prayer for vocations is available here at St. Francis of Assisi. The purpose of the Traveling Vocations Crucifix is to intercede for vocations and encourage children to consider a Priestly or Religious vocation themselves. The Crucifix represents the sacrifice Jesus made for us by dying on the Cross. Enthrone it in a highly visible place in your home and pray together at least once each day for vocations. You may use the prayers included with the Crucifix or substitute them with the Rosary or another simple prayer (such as the Our Father, Hail Mary, or the Glory Be). Each week or longer the Crucifix travels to a new family or household to help assist our awareness of a need for vocations.

The Traveling Vocations Crucifix is a wonderful way to unite Parishes in perpetual prayer for more Priestly and Religious vocations. If you or your family are interested in taking part in the Traveling Vocations Crucifix program, please contact the Parish Office at 539-1632. *The case with the Vocations Crucifix is now located in the main vestibule for the taking. Please sign the signup sheet, not only with your name, but also the date you are taking the Vocations Crucifix and the date you plan to return it, so that we are aware of where the Vocations Crucifix is located.*

Stewardship Reflection...Jesus comes to us without earthly glory but on a Cross, crowned by thorns. "The grandeur of His Kingdom is not power as defined in this world, but the love of God, a love capable of encountering and healing all things." (Pope Francis, *Homily*, November 20, 2016). Reflect on possibilities of how you can honor God through stewardship. "By their worthy deeds in this life, people make a limited but real human contribution to building up the Kingdom. They do so with the understanding that we will be held accountable for *our* actions, independent of the actions of others. And even though discipleship and stewardship set the necessary terms of Christian life in this world, they have their ultimate reward in another life." (*Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*, USCCB, 1993).

The Solemn Feast of Christ the King - Most of us have no experience of being subjects of a king, yet we freely identify Jesus as our King and Lord. Unlike earthly kings who simply maintain order, Christ's kingship involves the restoration of all persons and things to the original order intended by God. To offer one's life to Christ as Lord allows Him to eliminate the disorder in our relationships caused by sin and restore the relationships desired by God from the beginning of creation. Celebrating Christ's Kingship gives us the opportunity to proclaim the Good News that Christ's coming brings joy rather than fear, hope rather than despair, life rather than death. We are cleansed and renewed and brought closer to God. How appropriate it is to sing hymns and carry banners on the Feast Day of our King! In Advent, we will begin the new Church year by focusing on the final restoration of all creation to its original glory. In preparation, on the last Sunday of the Church year, we proclaim the expected Advent of the "Lord of lords" and "King of kings."
