#### SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS

During the Fourth Week of Lent, our focus is on the SIGN that was placed above the head of Jesus. First thought to be a SIGN OF CONDEMNATION, but now thought to be a SIGN OF VICTORY. The SIGN stands as a continued testimony of God's love for us. I.N.R.I. – Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews. The first letters of the Latin inscription which, by Pilate's order was placed on the Cross of Christ's Crucifixion (John 19:19). The words JESUS NAZARENUS REX IUDAEORUM were taken from Pilate's sentence. It was



written in Latin, the language of the administration in Judea and also in Hebrew/Aramaic, the common language of the Jews of the days and Greek, the language of the intellectual community. Because of the irrevocability of a Roman sentence, this inscription stood as written against the protest of the Jews who wished to disclaim Christ's Kingship (John 19:21). Thus, the inscription has become a lasting testimony of the Kingship of Jesus (Matthew 27:37). Above His Head they had put the charge against Him in writing:

THIS IS JESUS, KING OF THE JEWS (Mark 15:26). The inscription proclaiming His offense read: THE KING OF THE JEWS (Luke 23:28).

There was an inscription over His Head: THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS (John 19:19-22). Pilate had an inscription place on the Cross which read: JESUS THE NAZOREAN, THE KING OF THE JEWS. This inscription in Hebrew, Latin and Greek was read by many of the Jews, since the place was near the city. The Chief Priests of the Jews tried to tell Pilate, "You should not have written the King of the Jews." Write instead, "This Man claimed to be King of the Jews." Pilate answered, "What I have written, I have written."



#### **COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS**

In light of Bishop Mark's recent directives dated March 17, 2020, the following changes will be made to St. Francis of Assisi's Parish schedule.

The Church will be open on Saturdays from 3:00PM - 4:30PM and Sundays from 8:00AM - 10:00AM for private prayer. There will be NO public liturgies of any sort at the Church: weekday/weekend Masses, Holy Hours, Stations of the Cross until the COVID-19 crisis has passed. The whole purpose of these directives is to assist in the slowing of the spread of the coronavirus. The Bishop will review daily the situation and will alert us immediately as to when Masses and other public worship can be resumed.

At the direction of the Bishop, fr. Anthony Francis will continue to offer daily Mass for your behalf as well as for the intentions that have been scheduled each day. These Masses will be said privately. He will say only one Mass for Sunday but for all the intentions scheduled for the weekend Liturgies. Bishop Mark will preside at a Mass on Sundays at 11:00AM that will available on the Diocesan website and social media.

Because it seems unlikely that public Masses will be permitted until AFTER Easter, the Liturgies of Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum will also be celebrated privately by fr. Anthony Francis. The new Easter Candle as well as the new Holy Oils will be blessed and distributed once the restrictions have been lifted.

While there are no Baptisms or weddings currently scheduled during this crisis, direction has been given that both would take place privately and limited to immediate family.

All currently scheduled Confirmations have been postponed. The Bishop plans to reschedule Confirmations after the crisis has passed. Future dates, times and locations will be determined at the time.

All First Communions are postponed, as well, and will be rescheduled.

The Bishop has required that all Penance services be cancelled until the current restrictions on crowd size have been lifted. BUT, individual Confessions are permitted. fr. Anthony Francis will continue to hear individual Confessions at the time of Saturdays, 3:15PM - 4:00PM and Tuesday evenings from 5:45PM - 6:15PM. Disinfecting wipes will be available in the Reconciliation Room for penitents to wipe the wooden ledge, etc., before and after their Confession. Please dispose of them in wastepaper basket outside the reconciliation room.

Funerals may continue to be celebrated but only for immediate family members to attend. The time of the Funeral Mass will not be published either by the Parish nor by way of obituary. It is acceptable for families to request a Funeral Liturgy Outside of Mass to be held at the funeral home. Vigils will be conducted at the discretion of the families and funeral directors in keeping with the requirements of public safety.

The Bishop directs the following for the pastoral care of the sick. Visiting the sick in hospitals/rehabs will be done by the approved hospital chaplains keeping with the stipulations of the health care facilities. fr. Anthony Francis will only be able to visit nursing homes and other facilities IN DANGER OF DEATH and with the approval of the local facilities. Home visits will also only be made IN DANGER OF DEATH.

Individual appointments (one-on-one) may continue.

By direct order of the Bishop, all social gatherings are prohibited until further notice. This includes parish gatherings, meeting of parish groups, fish fries and other fundraisers. These measures are required in order to avoid person-toperson contact and spread of the COVID-19. Furthermore, because it is impossible to observe the necessary sterile procedures and because of the possibility of gatherings of people in excess of what is required for public safety, all takeout meals for fundraising must be suspended immediately.

Finally, questions about finances. These sacrifices are difficult for your parish. The suspension of our fundraising will hurt. The offering is very important to the parish and now, even that has ceased without public worship. The good news is, there is a way to give online to St. Francis of Assisi. There you will see another button to donate to your parish. This will assist us in being able to continue paying our bills! You certainly may mail your donations to the respective parish offices. 
