SYMBOLS OF THE PASSION OF JESUS



During the fifth week of Lent, DICE – instruments of chance, and a seamless GARMENT are placed at the foot of the Cross. Everything had to be, to fulfill all that the Scriptures said about the Messiah. **Matthew 27:35** – When they had crucified Him, they divided His garments, rolling dice for them to see what each should take.

Luke 23:24 – They divided His garments, rolling dice for them.

John 19:23-24 – After the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took His garments and divided four ways, one for each soldier. There was also His tunic, but this tunic was woven in one from top to bottom and had no seam. They said to each other, *We should not tear it. Let us dice and see who gets it.* The purpose of this was to have the Scriptures fulfilled – *They divided garments among them; for My clothing they cast lots.* (Psalm 228). And this is what the soldiers did.


Pope Francis Intention for April: Freedom from Addiction. That those suffering addiction from addiction may be helped and accompanied.

Thursday, April 2 – St. Francis of Paola, Hermit – died 1507; founded (1435) the Order of Minims [O.M.], a congregation of hermits, "the least of God's household"; today they number about 115 Religious.

Saturday, April 3 – St. Isidore, Bishop & Doctor of the Church – died 636; succeeded his brother, St. Leander, as Bishop of Seville; presided over the Council of Toledo (631); completed the Mozarabic liturgy; combatted Arianism in Spain; known as the "Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages," especially for his *Etymologies*.

This is a simple and loving act of Spiritual Communion we are called to make in these times, while we are unable to attend Mass and receive the Eucharist:
