What is Spiritual Communion?

Spiritual Communion is the practice of desiring union with Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. It is used primarily by individuals who cannot receive Holy Communion, such as the ill, the divorced and remarried, and those who have not yet been received into full communion with the Church. St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace Him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive Him in Sacramental Communion.

ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Instead, widows and widowers who register will be recognized as part of the Sunday Mass celebrated privately on May 31 at St. John Gualbert Cathedral. Bishop Mark will be the celebrant and homilist, and deceased spouses of all registered individuals will be acknowledged and remembered during the Liturgy. The Mass will air live at 11:00AM on WATM ABC 23 and will be rebroadcast at 9:00PM on Atlantic Broadband Channel 9. GETTING CHUMMY WITH THE SAINTS WITNESSES TO THE FAITH AND COMPANIONS ON OUR JOURNEY OF FAITH

Tuesday, May 12 – Ss. Nereus & Achilles, Martyrs – died end of 1st century; Pope St. Damasus states that they were Praetorian soldiers who converted to Christianity; their *acta* report that they were beheaded during the reign of Trajan (98-117) on the island of Terracina.

Tuesday, May 12 – St. Pancras, Martyr – died 304; his "acts" state that he was a Syrian or Phrygian orphan who came to Rome where he was converted to Christianity; he was beheaded under Diocletian in his fourteenth year; buried on the Via Aurelia.

Wednesday, May 13 – Our Lady of Fatima – Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children – Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos – received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the Rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite Nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97. St. Pope John Paul the Great directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "Bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against St. Pope John Paul the Great in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981. The Feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the

local Bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

Thursday, May 14 – St. Matthias, Apostle – died 1st century; chosen to replace Judas; qualified because he witnessed Jesus' ministry and Resurrection; said to have suffered martyrdom either at Colchis (modern day Georgia) or in Jerusalem; mentioned in the Roman Canon.

Friday, May 15 – St. Isidore – died 1130; layman whose wife, Maria de la Cabeza (Torribia) is also a Saint; farm laborer associated with miracles; patron of Madrid, of famers, and of rural communities.

Saturday, May 16 – St. Margaret of Cortona, Penitent, III Order – born of farming parents in Laviano, Tuscany. Her mother died when she was seven; life with her stepmother was so difficult that she moved out. For nine years she lived with Arsenio, though they were not married, and she bore him a son. In those years, she had doubts about her situation. Somewhat like St. Augustine, she prayed for purity – but not just yet. One day she was waiting for Arsenio and was instead met by his dog. The animal led Margaret into the forest where she found Arsenio murdered. This crime shocked Margaret into a life of penance. She and her son returned to Laviano, where she was not well received by her stepmother. They then went to Cortona, where her son eventually became a Friar. In 1277, three years after her conversion, Margaret became a Franciscan tertiary. Under the direction of her confessor, who sometimes had to order her to moderate her self-denial, she pursued a life of prayer and penance at Cortona. There she established a hospital and founded a congregation of tertiary sisters. The poor and humble Margaret, was, like Francis, devoted to the Eucharist and the Passion of Jesus. These devotions fueled her great charity and drew sinners to her for advice and inspiration. She was canonized in 1728.
