What is Spiritual Communion?

Spiritual Communion is the practice of desiring union with Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. It is used primarily by individuals who cannot receive Holy Communion, such as the ill, the divorced and remarried, and those who have not yet been received into full communion with the Church. St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace Him" at a time or in circumstances when we cannot receive Him in Sacramental Communion.

ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Fr. John Voytek, OFMConv., former Administrator at St. Anne Parish, Davidsville

Fr. John Voytek has been appointed to be a confessor at St. Peter's Basilica. The Franciscan Friars Conventual have served as the official confessors at the Vatican Basilica since 1774, when Pope Clement XIV in his Apostolic Letter Miserator Dominus established our order as the "College of the Penitentiaries." Upon passing his examination at the Vatican on the 12th of May, John was immediately taken to the Chapel of the Penitentiaries by Cardinal Mauro Piacenza, and Regent Msgr. Krystof Josef Nykiel, to take his oath and make his profession of Faith. Having signed the official documents, the Vatican officials enrolled John in the official ranks of friars who for 246 years have carried out this great service of the Order to the Church.

Monday, June 1 – The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church – On February 11, 2018, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued a Decree implementing Pope Francis' decision that the Memorial of the "Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church" be inscribed in the General Roman Calendar and observed on the Monday following Pentecost, taking precedence over conflicting obligatory Memorials. The joyous veneration given to the Mother of God by the contemporary Church, in light of reflection on the mystery of Christ and on His nature, cannot ignore the figure of a woman (cf. Gal 4:4), the Virgin Mary, who is both the Mother of Christ and Mother of the Church.

Tuesday, June 2 – Ss. Marcellinus & Peter, Martyrs – Marcellinus, presbyter, and Peter, exorcist, died 303; beheaded under Diocletian; both mentioned in the Roman Canon.

Wednesday, June 3 – S. Charles Lwanga & Companions, Martyrs – Charles Lwanga and twenty-one Ugandan companions, died Nov. 15, 1885 - Jan. 27, 1887; proto-Martyrs of Black Africa; over one hundred killed in this period, including Anglicans; Charles is the patron Saint of African Catholic Youth Action.

Friday, June 5 – St. Boniface, Bishop & Martyr – died 754; Anglo-Saxon O.S.B.; founded Abbey of Fulda; Bishop of Mainz; martyred along with thirty companions at Dokkum in Frisia; known as the "Apostle of Germany."

Saturday, June 6 – St. Norbert, Bishop – died 1134; founded (1120) the Premonstratensians or "Norbertines," [O. Praem], today numbering some 1200 members; Archbishop of Magdeburg; strong supporter of Church reform and evangelization; devoted to the Holy Eucharist.
