

Anointing of the Sick Communal – Celebration 2nd Sunday of Advent and 3rd Sunday of Lent.

Marriage in accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

Christian Initiation (**RCIA**) – Those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who are interested in learning more about their Catholic Faith, may call the Parish office for more information.

ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT THE LACK OF VOCATIONS TO THE PRIESTHOOD? THEN READ ON! VOCATION CRUCIFIX- A special Crucifix that travels from family to family or household to household ordinarily for 1 week or longer to inspire prayer for vocations is available here at St. Francis of Assisi. The purpose of the Traveling Vocations Crucifix is to intercede for vocations and encourage children to consider a Priestly or Religious vocation themselves. The Crucifix represents the sacrifice Jesus made for us by dying on the Cross. Enthrone it in a highly visible place in your home and pray together at least once each day for vocations. You may use the prayers included with the Crucifix or substitute them with the Rosary or another simple prayer (such as the Our Father, Hail Mary, or the Glory Be). Each week or longer the Crucifix travels to a new family or household to help assist our awareness of a need for vocations.

The Traveling Vocations Crucifix is a wonderful way to unite Parishes in perpetual prayer for more Priestly and Religious vocations. If you or your family are interested in taking part in the Traveling Vocations Crucifix program, please take the case with the Vocations Crucifix which is now located in the **ACTIVITY CENTER**. There are modifications/restrictions/recommendations concerning the re-opening of our Parish. There are concerns regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19) since the virus is still that silent enemy around us. We need to realize that no matter how many precautions we take, there remains a risk of contracting/spreading the virus.

Here is what we need to know and be cautious about:

1. Weekend Masses are Saturday at 4 p.m. and Sunday at 7:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. These Masses will be celebrated in the Activity Center – the main reason is that due to SOCIAL DISTANCING, our Parish Church can accommodate only 60 people. We are able to accommodate a greater number in the Activity Center.

SINCE WE DO NOT KNOW AT THIS TIME HOW MANY PEOPLE WILL BE COMING TO MASS, I'd RATHER BE PREPARED FOR A GREATER NUMBER, SHOULD NUMBERS BE SMALLER THAN WE EXPECT WE WILL MOVE TO THE CHURCH. I am not sure about how many weekends we will be utilizing the Activity Center;

2. Weekday Masses are Mon., Wed, Thurs, Fri and Sat. at 9 a.m. while Mass on Tuesday is at 6:15 p.m. in the Church.

Whether we are in the Activity Center or the Church, we are asked to honor the wearing of facial masks and social distancing. The Activity Center will be set-up in 3 sections of chairs;

Section 1 – single chairs

Section 2-2 single chairs to accommodate a couple

Section 3 - 4 - 6 chairs to accommodate family members who RESIDE IN THE SAME

HOUSEHOLD

3. As long as Weekend Masses are in the Activity Center, Confessions will be heard on Saturday at 3:15 p.m. in the Activity Center – Confessions on Tuesdays before Mass will be heard in the Church.

The Church has been arranged by blue tape closing off entry to every other pew. Again, please be aware of SOCIAL DISTANCING in the open pews.

WHAT CAN WE EXPECT AT MASS?

- 1. Sorry but facial masks are to be worn at all times unless a person is receiving the Holy Eucharist on the tongue; (it is being highly recommended that persons receive in the hand rather than on the tongue;
 - 2. Social distancing;
 - 3. No physical contact at the Sign of Peace; (nod the head, wave the hand, blow a kiss);
 - 4. Little communal singing;
 - 5. No presentation of the bread and wine at the Offertory;
- 6. An usher will be holding a collection container before Mass begins and at the very end of Mass for your offertory/ there will be no collection during the Mass;

A few questions that are probably on the minds of many people are:

HOW LONG MIGHT WE BE DOING THIS?

The Bishop has not indicated how long we will have to endure these restrictions.

WHEN WILL THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS RETURN?

Good question but again there has been no directive concerning this question from the Bishop or the Pennsylvania Conference of Bishops or the USCCB. I guess we need to take 1 step at a time and 1 day at a time.

I sincerely thank you all for your understanding, cooperation and patience in regard to the above matters.
