Prayer to St. Corona Patroness of Epidemic Victims



Lord Jesus Christ, You came into this world for our salvation. Look kindly on us now, we pray, that we, and all those who serve You, might be kept safe from this epidemic. Heal those who are sick, comfort the suffering, bring back those who have gone astray, and above all, increase our Faith, O Lord.

Give us the Grace to follow You and, like the Martyr St. Corona, who gave her life for love of You, to take up our crosses daily without fear or hesitation.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

St. Corona, Patroness of epidemic victims, pray for us. Amen.

St. Francis of Assisi

Francesco, the son of Peter Bernadone, a wealthy merchant of Assisi, was born in the year 1182. He was generous, fun-loving of good humor, handsome and a popular youth of Assisi. His ambition was to become a knight in the service of his beloved city, Assisi. In a battle against the neighboring city of Perugia, he was wounded and taken prisoner to return to Assisi a year later a physically and spiritually broken young man. Upon recovering he was a changed person. He began to experience a great longing for perfection, heroic self-conquest and a longing to recognize God's will in his life. Francis so loved especially the poor that he frequently associated with them. Complying with a Divine Command he went about begging for stones to repair dilapidated churches around Assisi. His father, enraged with his conduct, brought his son before the Bishop of Assisi whereby Francis returned to his father not only money but also the clothes he wore saying: "Now I can truly say, Our Father, Who art in Heaven." The Bishop provided him with a beggar's garment and thus began Francis' new life of seeking God's Will in all things. In 1208, Francis while attending Mass at the Portiuncula heard in the Gospel in which Our Lord commissioned His Apostles to carry nothing with themselves, garbed himself in a penitential garb, girded with a cord, without shoes, entered upon a life of complete poverty and began to preach penance. Several prominent young men of Assisi joined him and when they were eleven, they went to Rome where Pope Innocent III gave approval to the new order. They lived in severest poverty and in brotherly harmony preaching penance to the people both by word and by example. St, Francis called them Friars

Minor so that they might always regard the virtue of humility as the foundation of perfection. In order to open the way of perfection for all who wished to imitate his life, he established a second order (The Poor Clares) and a Third Order for people of both sexes living in the world. It was above all the Passion and Death of Christ on the Cross that filled his heart with love of his Savior as he strove to become as similar to the object of his love that two years before his death, on Mount LaVerna the Crucified Savior appeared to St. Francis in the form of a Seraph and impressed on his body the marks of the Five Sacred Wounds. Lying on the bare ground, in imitation of his Savior's death on the Cross, St. Francis died on October 3, 1226. Due to the miracles attributed to St. Francis and because his renown was known throughout the world, Pope



Gregory IX came to Assisi and on Sunday, July 16, 1228 (less than two years after his death) and canonized St. Francis.
