


Jesus said that the Kingdom of Heaven is like an vineyard owner who needed to harvest his grapes. Early in the morning he went to the centre of town and there he found some workers. He bargained and then hired there. Concerned that his crop would not be harvested in time, he want back and employed more workers promising to pay them a fair wage. He was still worded about the crop and he went out at lunch time, 3 o'clock and then at 5 o'clock. Each time he hired more workers and each time he gave his word to pay a fair wage.


The Vineyard Laborers

Help the labourers to find their way through the vineyard to the grapes.

As the light of the day began to fade, the owner called for all the workers to come in and receive their wages. He started with those that were last to be hired. He paid each group the same wage. Those that had started work earlier in the day started to gramble. The vineyard owner challenged them by reminding there he had paid the agreed amount. If he chose to be more generous then that was his choice and they should not be so resentful. The first will be last and the last will be first.





Jesus tells the story of a man who went out to find workers to work in his field for the day. He went out five different times to find more workers. At the end he was kind and gave each of them

1 Denarius – even those who worked for only part of the day.
