

Anointing of the Sick Communal Celebration 2nd Sunday of Advent and 3rd Sunday of Lent.

Marriage in accordance with Diocesan directives, arrangements must be made at least 9 months before the marriage date. All couples are required to attend Diocesan sponsored Pre-Cana sessions and to participate in the FOCCUS inventory. Call the Rectory for information and schedules.

Christian Initiation (**RCIA**) – Those who are interested in becoming Catholic, as well as those who are interested in learning more about their Catholic Faith, may call the Parish office for more information.

Registration, the practice of stewardship (the regular use of envelopes) and regular participation in the Eucharist indicates active membership and eligibility to act as a Godparent or Sponsor. FR. STEVEN FRENIER former Parochial Vicar here at St. Francis of Assisi Parish remains in the ICU but is improving. The Province Health Administrator gave the hospital consent to insert a central line to make blood draws and make medications easier to administer. He is still on a ventilator at 45% oxygen. They will try weaning him from the ventilator and see how he does.. All the friars of St. Mark Friary, Boynton Beach, Fl where Fr. Steven is assigned have tested positive for COVID19. Our prayers are with them.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - As you are well aware, because of the pandemic Religious Education has taken a different approach this year. 
Background on the Gospel Reading

Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and His Disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to Him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew His identity and would have revealed it to those who were present. On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for Him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' Disciples – they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to His Disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places.

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee. Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed Himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the Disciples found Him, He told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in His prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for His guidance and direction in our lives.

ASH WEDNESDAY



During this time of pandemic, the Holy See has modified the method of distributing ashes as contained in the flowing Note from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments issued on January 12, 2021: The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with Holy Water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general" "Repent and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and unto dust you shall return."

The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him, or if appropriate, he goes to those who are

standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything. Although not mentioned in the NOTE ON ASH WEDNESDAY, in addition to the Priest, a Deacon is an Ordinary Minister for the distribution of ashes. Lay persons, as Extraordinary Ministers, may assist in the distribution of ashes that are already blessed by a Priest/Deacon either at Mass or by taking them to the sick or shut-ins. Also, ashes may be blessed and distributed for groups outside of Mass according tohe format described in the *Book of Blessings*, n. 1656-1678.

The most important variance as indicated by the NOTE from the Congregation for divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments is the sprinkling of ashes on the top of each person's head. This is to avoid the physical contact which occurs when the ashes are placed on the forehead in the Sign of the Cross.

In offering instruction to the people concerning the distribution of ashes in this manner, it would be helpful to explain that this is common manner that is used in Europe and elsewhere for centuries.
