### **Background on the Gospel Reading**

The third and final section of Luke's Sermon on the Plain begins: And He told them a parable. There are actually four parables, three of which we read today. They are all about how to be a good disciple.

The blind cannot lead the blind. And a disciple cannot be a good disciple unless he or she has learned from the Teacher. Everyone who is fully trained is like the Teacher Who knows how to cure the blind. Before you can be a good disciple and teach others you must take care of yourself. Do not try to take a speck out of your brother's eye until you have taken the board out of your own. Finally, only when you have purified yourself can you produce the good works that the Teacher requires. Discipleship asks us to produce good deeds. But to produce them requires the integrity and purity of heart found in the Teacher. When people see your good deeds they will know that this is because you have a good heart.

The final parable, which we do not read today, is about building on the solid foundation of rock and not on sand. This is the only way to face the difficulties a disciple will encounter and survive.

# 8<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time (February 27)

The US Bishops' pastoral letter *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response* was published in 1992 as a challenge to embrace a mature discipleship that requires a decision to follow Jesus Christ no matter the cost. This commitment leads to a way of life, not just a series of action and is transformational. Our diocese rose to the challenge with personal and communal commitments of genuine sharing of Time, Talent and Treasure to all God's children at that time and is still continuing to this day.

Our activity as stewards is valuable because it is bringing about a Kingdom of God that exists here and now as Jesus taught through parables and actions of love. When you are deciding how much you will give of your resources to others, do you determine what the amount will be based by judging someone else's first? If you feel you are giving more because someone was selfish and gave less, look into your heart and ask Jesus to help you give with an honest heart of love." A good man produces goodness from the good in his heart. Each man speaks from his heart's abundance." (Lk 6:454)
