HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

Background on the Gospel Reading

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares His Mission to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven with His Disciples. The signs of the Kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The Disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the Ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that He has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' Death and Resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions Twelve Apostles. Many scholars believe that the Twelve Apostles symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and the Church.

Matthew lists the names of the Twelve Apostles, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word *Apostle* when referring to the Twelve. The word *Apostle* means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the Twelve Apostles are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent His Disciples to continue His Work and Mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is His continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this Mission.

Jesus makes clear the connection between discipleship with Him and service and leadership to those who are lost and in need. Whenever the stewards of the Church become more attentive to their own well-being than to their mission to be Christ's body in the world, they will become lost.

How are you planning to give your time, talent and treasure to the lost sheep in today's world? The Christian heart cannot be indifferent. Let your heart be moved to an act of stewardship or assistance for one of them. In your time and place, how can you respond to the call to be a laborer for the harvest? (2023, *At Home With the Word*, LTP)

Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion under Both Kinds in the Diocese of United States of America

The Christian faithful are to be instructed that the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and divine, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and consequently that as far as the effects are concerned, those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any grace that is necessary for salvation. While Holy Communion under both kinds has a fuller sign, any of the faithful who wish to receive Holy Communion under the species of bread alone are to be granted their wish. C.f. **General Instruction of the Roman Missal**, 2011, Number 282.
